





SOCIAL AND CULTURAL LIFE.—The boys have every opportunity for enjoyment of this kind in the various school societies, such as the debating society and the music club. Besides the annual school concert, short chambermusic concerts are held, and to these boys may bring their friends. The school library is open to each boy. Considerable attention is given to the great advantages that the school has in its nearness to the cultural centres of London, and visits are organised to various galleries, concerts and museums. School societies are supported from a general "club" fund to which each entrant is called upon to pay one single contribution of 7s. 6d., payable at the school and not at the bank.

SCHOOL CAMP.—St. Marylebone Grammar School is at present making an important educational experiment in sending boys to work for a week, during Summer Term, in country quarters situated in a beautiful part of Surrey. The present cost is 17s. 6d. per week, including full board and fares. Special curriculum is undertaken, and it is hoped that each parent will try to see that his boy, unless medically exempt, shall enjoy the great stimulus to health, initiative and comradeship that the Camp affords.
