- 1. The Association received during 2004 a generous donation of £2,000 from Mrs Clara Waters to fund an annual toast at the dinner in memory of her husband, Basil. In 2008, Mrs Waters kindly donated a further £500. The balance carried forward to 2009 was £1,548.70 Port at RAF Club Dinner in 2009 was £337.70. The balance being carried forward to 2010 will be £1,211.00
- 2. £100 invested in 31/2% War Stock 1929-47.
- 3. Stock of ties -12 (Selling Price £132.00); Bow Ties 4 (Selling Price £56.00). Sales of books and Cards are now included in this figure.
- 4. The Associations Books have now been placed into stock together with the master copies. All 5 publications are now available for sale, however we will need to get them printed almost on a back to back requirement, governed by demand and/or economic reproduction costs.
