





at a cost of £4,400. The two plane trees in the forecourt were planted in 1863. Additional buildings were erected in the 1920's. guineas barely half covered the cost and this provision was suspended in 1800. The History The total site which fronted Marylebone Road and Lisson Grove was acquired by Asda Group pic in 1987. The buildings had become derelic from 6 years of neglect and misuse by vagrant. The 'additional' buildings were demolished and replaced by an office building and heavily flast. The extant Gothic Building was restored to its original character by Gareliey, the property development arm of Asda, under strict surveillance by English Heritage. Edwin Abbott was considered the school's greatest headmaster. He was appointed in 1827 at the age of 19 and remained in office for 45 years. Under his stewardship the school attained a high academic reputation and prospered financially. The original aim of the Philological School was that there should be forty scholars - "ten for the ministry, ten for the navy and twenty for mechanics", Nominees were usually children of subscribers' own dependants although some were just sons of "the deserving poor". of St Marylebone Administration of the school transferred to the London City Council in 1909. By 1935 there were 477 boys on the roll and the school was full. The stated motive for the Philological School was "to Grammar rescue unguarded youth from vice, render them truly useful and ornamental to the British Isle...that boys of good capacities may not be buried in obscurity". With the establishment of a nearby comprehensive school, St Marylebone Grammar School closed in 1981. The school was founded at Fitzroy Square in 1792 as The Philological School. It moved to its present site in 1827 to premises that were replaced in 1856 by the present building. The school was renamed St Marylebone Grammar School in 1901. 
